




Choose a studio, one bedroom or two bedroom apartment.



Lakeland

Located in Polk County, an adjoining neighbor to Tampa and Orlando, Lakeland, Florida is home to 13 natural lakes. Each of the lakes, including, of course, Lake Gibson, takes on such distinct personalities of their own that they often act as reference points for residents in place of street names.



After receiving a request from Lakeland's own Mrs. Robert Pickardt in 1957, the Queen of England donated two royal Mute Swans from London's Thames River, which, over the following decades, went on to populate Lakes Morton, Mirror and Wire with a flock that now includes over 80 swans. The lakes are also inhabited by a considerable array of other breathtaking feathered creatures.

Other notable points of interest include Lake Mirror Park.

The lake is home to a spacious amphitheater, attractive and accommodating pedestrian walkways, the Frank Lloyd Wright architectural collection at Florida Southern College, the Hollis Garden, with 10,000 flowers and indigenous plants, and the storied Historic and Antiques District, with art galleries, stores and restaurants, all conveniently located in the heart of the city.
